Memories of Aviano...

OUR FIRST 24 HOURS IN ITALY

Our first night in Italy (1960) was not only difficult, but very funny. Because of a family emergency, our sponsor, Lt. Kessler, had to drop us off quickly at our hotel, leaving us to indoctrinate ourselves into Italian life. The Cesaro Hotel catered primarily to men who worked during the week for Zanuzzi Rex, the kitchen appliance manufacturer, which was tucked away in a large corn field between Pordenone and Sacile—and what seemed miles from Aviano and Pordenone. Where were the Americans? Where was the air base? And how do we get there or anywhere without transportation?

Dragging luggage for our young family of four across the parking lot, up the stairs, and into a large entrata, we finally located our rooms that were across the entrata from each other. At the end of the entrata was a filthy community bathroom with a shower that sprayed over the toilet and a big ring around the bathtub. Oh dear, can we handle this?

We decided quickly that being separated would not be a good idea, so we spent our first night sharing two single beds on mattresses filled with corn husks. Yes, in 1960! At around 3 pm, we were hungry, so I ran down to the bar to get some food and cleaning items. Unfortunately, everything was closed. Riposo, of course. I tried again at around 5 pm, but still everything was closed. However, I smelled something wonderful coming from behind one door and knocked. A pudgy, gray-haired woman opened up and I politely inquired, "Hello, will you please tell me when the restaurant will be opened?" She shrugged her shoulders in obvious admission that she didn't speak English. What now, I thought? Okay, let's play charades! So, I opened my mouth, pretended to chew, and she apparently got the picture and rattled off something I couldn't understand...until she pointed to her watch and to the number 7. That I understood!

So, we made our way to the restaurant at 7 pm, and our waiter took us to a table with a white tablecloth. It was a large room with over 20 tables filled with men all dressed in dark blue suits, white shirts, and ties. All of them turned their heads and watched as we made our grand entrance, especially the two females. The waiter brought us a menu, but who among us could read a menu in Italian handwriting? Impossible!

After more charades, I finally got a typed menu, but since it was still in Italian, of course, the only words I understood were spaghetti and pollo. So, we ordered spaghetti and pollo. The spaghetti looked



strange with only about a teaspoon of tomato sauce and dab of butter, but we were hungry. We were expecting some good old country fried chicken, but instead it arrived cold, saturated with oil, and with rosemary covering the goosebumpy skin. In true American style, we proceeded to pick it up and eat with our fingers, noticing all the men watching us. Still hungry, we wanted some dessert. The waiter was very patient as Gene thumbed through his trusty Italian dictionary, but saw only an entry for the word "desert." So Gene pointed to it and said, "with two s's." We laughed knowing that would not get us anywhere, but then I spied a bowl of fruit and pointed to it. Thank goodness he understood. The waiter then brought us four bowls of water and placed them in front of us. Gene and I looked at each other, puzzled. I said, "Honey, they must be finger bowls." So, I proceeded to daintily place my fingertips in the water, with Gene following suit. Suddenly, we noticed our daughter, age 9, washing her hands in it, while our son, age 4, was taking the water up his almost to his elbows. By then, the waiter was bringing the fruit to our table, but stopped short when he saw what was happening. Honestly, he slapped his forehead and said, "Mama mia!" and then turned to tell all of the men what we were doing, and they began to laugh. At first we were embarrassed and even a little angry since we didn't know what he had said. And we're not talking about light chuckles here, but loud, continuous laughter for 15-20 minutes! Laughter is infectious, though, so before long we were joining them. The waiter returned with four fresh bowls of water and demonstrated the correct way to clean and cut a pear using our forks and knives --- our first lesson in Italian etiquette. Our second lesson: do not pick up chicken with our fingers.

I must add that it ended up as a blessing to live at the Cesaro Hotel, because it became home to us. Our children played in the corn field making forts (it was so big that the padrone didn't mind). And the men played with them in the parking lot. They also thanked me for the clean bathroom, and the women of the kitchen later saved my son's life from choking. We have so many wonderful memories of our 54 days in that hotel! That was the beginning of what would be a beautiful assignment in Italy, with so many great memories.

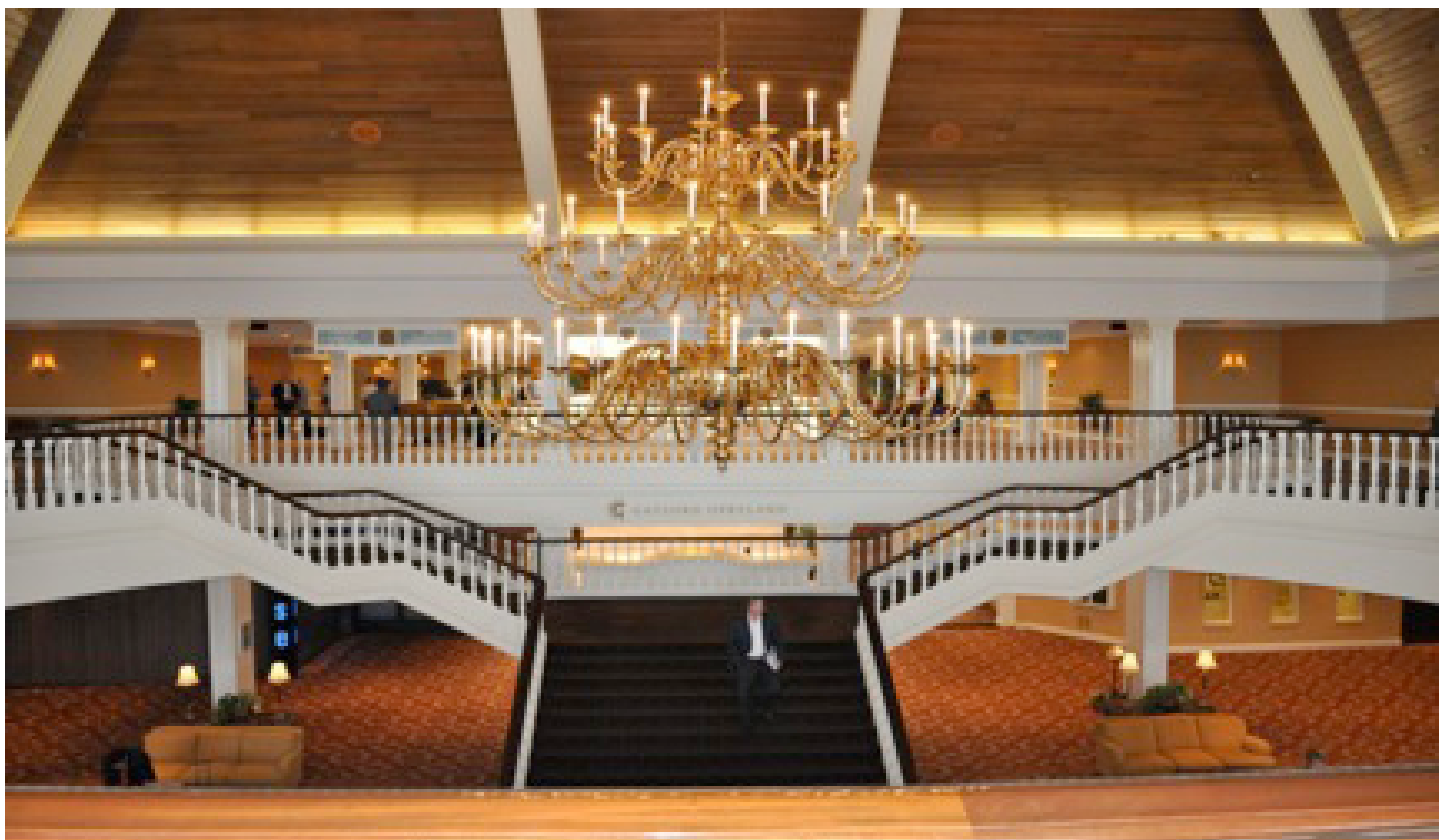

VEAL CUTLET PILLOWS WITH MARSALA SAUCE



Thin sliced veal cutlets
Thin sliced prociutto
Thin sliced (fontina, mozerella,
Or provelone) cheese
Chicken or beef broth
Flour

Pound veal thin and cut into 2x 2 inch pieces
Coat with flour mixed with salt and pepper
Sautee cutlets in butter and olive oil
(About 1 minute per side)
Set aside

Prepare marsala sauce:

3-4 Tablespoons Olive Oil
¼ cup onion, finely chopped
1-tablespoon garlic, finely chopped
½ pound mushrooms, sliced
1-tablespoon flour
¾ cup Marsala Wine
1-½ cups beef stock or chicken stock
Salt and Pepper to taste

Add olive oil to heavy hot saucepan. Add onions, garlic, mushrooms, sauté until mushrooms are tender. Add flour and cook for 1 minute then deglaze with Marsala Wine. Add beef stock and cook until thick and flavors are blended.

Build pillow:

Veal cutlet
Prociutto
Cheese
Veal cutlet

Place into baking dish with
Broth just covering bottom of dish and bake for
About 30 minutes

Members in the News

The Lackland Gateway Heritage Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit organization founded to help preserve Lackland's enlisted Airman history. Every airman coming into the USAF goes through Lackland Air Force Base for Basic Military Training. The goal of the foundation is to build a new state-of-the-art enlisted heritage museum on Lackland with a targeted completion in 2015. Estimated cost for the facility is estimated at up to \$50 million.

Aviano Reunion Association members Jaime Vazquez and Ben Catalina serve the foundation. Jaime is the foundation President, and Ben is the Paver Program Manager. The paver program is the first foundation fundraiser to raise money for the new museum. Allocated funds from the US Air Force may not be used for this project, so the foundation is responsible for total funding of the project.

The paver program was patterned from other Air Force, Army and other military facilities. The pavers will be used as a long term project to beautify the base, starting specifically with the Basic Military Training Parade Ground area. The pavers will be used to create a Top Honor Graduate section on the parade ground to honor the Air Force's finest graduate each week. Pavers will also be used to create paved areas in front of each grandstand, as well as in front of each aircraft on display along airplane row. The aging existing sidewalk will eventually be replaced with pavers. Thousands upon thousands of pavers are needed for this long-term project.

Those Avianoites who attended the Reunion in San Antonio in 2004 should remember the trip we made to sit in the VIP section and observe the graduation ceremony. This traditional military ceremony celebrating the successful completion of basic training occurs 50 times per year on Fridays, and involves approximately 750 to 800 graduates each week. It is witnessed weekly by over 2,000 proud parents, relatives, and friends each week, as well as a group of special guests, like we were.

To raise money for the museum, the foundation has launched the paver sales program. Each paver (aka "brick") can be purchased and be engraved to honor a graduate, a family member who has served in the USAF, and even relatives and friends who served in other services. Civilians who were never in the military can even purchase a paver and have it engraved to show their support. Pavers are \$55 each, with two or more for \$50 each. They are tax deductible.

Jaime and Ben have purchased their own pavers, but have also donated personal funds to purchase two pavers that will be engraved in appreciation for the Aviano Reunion Association. The two ARA pavers will be engraved and installed as follows:
